

LETTER FROM OUR PRESIDENT

DEAR FRIENDS,

I HOPE THIS LETTER FINDS YOU WELL. EVERY YEAR OUR ANNUAL REPORT PROVIDES A COMPREHENSIVE OVERVIEW OF OUR ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE PAST YEAR. I HOPE THIS YEAR'S REPORT WILL PROVIDE YOU WITH A PORTRAIT OF THE INCREDIBLE IMPACT OF OUR TEAMS' WORK TO SAVE THE LIVES OF OUR MANY FURRY FRIENDS.

DESPITE THE RECENT DIP IN REVENUE, WE WERE ABLE TO RISE TO MEET THE CHALLENGES 2023 PRESENTED. WE HAD SEVERAL SURRENDERED AND STRAY ANIMALS COME INTO THE SHELTER WITH INFECTIOUS DISEASES REQUIRING THE ANIMALS TO BE HOUSED IN QUARANTINE AND/OR ISOLATION. THE CARE FOR THESE VERY ILL ANIMALS IS DIFFICULT PHYSICALLY AND EMOTIONALLY FOR THE STAFF.DUE TO THESE SITUATIONS, THE SHELTER HAD TO BE CLOSED TO THE PUBLIC AND VOLUNTEERS, CREATING EXTRA WORK FOR OUR STAFF AND SIGNIFICANT ADDITIONAL COSTS FOR MEDICAL SUPPLIES AND VETERINARY CARE. OUR STAFF IS INVALUABLE! BESIDES THE INTENSIVE MEDICAL CARE TO NURSE THESE ANIMALS BACK TO HEALTH, THEY GIVE THEM THE LOVE. CARE. AND THE SECOND CHANCE THEY DESERVE.

THROUGHOUT THE YEAR WE HAVE REMAINED DEDICATED TO OUR MISSION, ACHIEVING SIGNIFICANT MILESTONES AND GROWTH. INVESTING IN OUR STAFF AND INFRASTRUCTURE IS CRUCIAL TO SUPPORT TWO CAMPUSES AND MEET THE EVOLVING NEEDS OF OUR COMMUNITY. THIS STRATEGIC MOVE AIMS TO ENHANCE OUR CAPABILITIES FOR SUSTAINED GROWTH.

OUR SUCCESS AS A HIGH-SAVE SHELTER IS THANKS TO THE INCREDIBLE CONTRIBUTIONS OF VOLUNTEERS, DEDICATED STAFF, AND GENEROUS DONORS LIKE YOU. WE COULDN'T DO IT WITHOUT YOU

2023 WAS A TOUGH YEAR FOR VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES DUE TO OUR CLOSURES RELATED TO DISEASE CONTAINMENT ON BOTH CAMPUSES. OUR VOLUNTEERS ROSE TO THE OCCASION BY ASSISTING US IN OUR FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES, STUFFING ENVELOPES, WALKING AND SOCIALIZING OUR ANIMALS WHEN THE CAMPUSES WERE OPEN AND HELPING US WITH ADOPTION EVENTS. WE HAVE 126 FOSTER VOLUNTEERS AND A TOTAL OF 230 ACTIVE VOLUNTEERS WITH OVER 45,000 HOURS TRACKED. THEIR HELP EQUATES TO OVER \$675K IN SAVINGS FOR OPHS.

FOSTER TO ADOPT

FOR THOSE ANIMALS THAT DO NOT DO WELL IN A SHELTER ENVIRONMENT WE ARE FORTUNATE TO HAVE VOLUNTEERS THAT PROVIDE A LOVING HOME AND OFTEN BECOMING A FOREVER HOME. OUR FOSTER FAMILIES CARED FOR MORE THAN 150 ANIMALS OVER THE YEAR.



SHELTER POPULATION AND CAPACITY

THE OPHS OVERALL POPULATION VARIES FROM YEAR TO YEAR BUT THE AVERAGE ADOPTION RANGE IS FROM 1,000 TO 1,500 ANIMALS.

BARK HOUSE

THE BARK HOUSE HAS 42 KENNELS, WITH ROOM FOR ANOTHER 15 EMERGENCY OVERFLOW HOUSING IN SOCIALIZATION ROOMS, CRATES, OUTDOOR TEMPORARY SHELTER (HOLDING FOR RETURN TO OWNER) AND ISOLATION CONDOS. ALSO OPHS PROVIDES FOOD, MEDICATIONS AND VET CARE FOR FOSTER CARE.

TOTAL MAXIMUM CAPACITY- 57 CANINE FOSTER CARE VARIES- AVERAGE 31 DOGS





KITTY CITY

THE KITTY CITY HAS ROAMING ROOMS, CAT CONDOS AND CAT KENNELS. FOSTER VOLUNTEERS ALSO CARE FOR ANIMALS WHERE OPHS PROVIDE FOOD, MEDICATIONS AND MEDICAL CARE.
